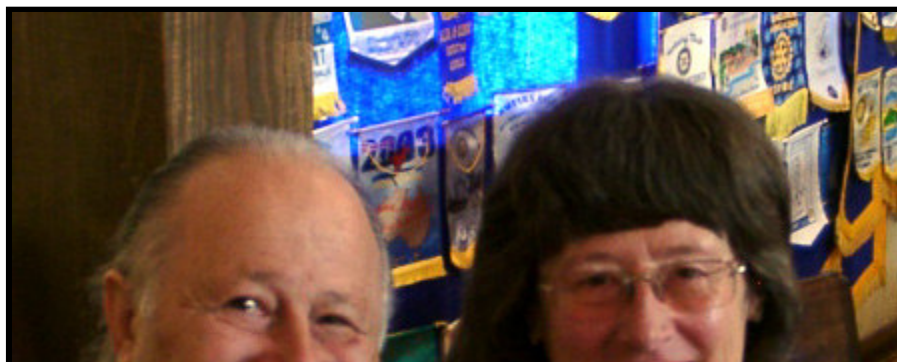
into our midst as a Realtor, sponsored by JIM OSER. PETER PATTENGILL did

**April 26, 2005**

Drew McIntyre introduced Paul Schwarzbart and his wife Sharry.



Paul is a professor and author who has written a book about his early life as a child refugee from the Nazis in Belgium in the early 1940's. The title is ***Breaking the Silence*** which is a rather odd title considering that writers since the 1940's have been anything but silent about the Nazi horrors committed in Europe at that time. However, it is a new perspective on the actions of Belgian citizens in saving young Jewish children from the unbelievable actions of the Nazis at that time. We know from the Diary of Ann Frank that the Dutch were willing to stick their necks out for the children and we've heard TED's friend, a Dane, and his "adventures" against the Germans so this account of the Belgians is most interesting. PAUL was 10 years old when the things that happened were indelibly imprinted on his mind. His life in the Catholic School in the country and the courage of the teachers and people responsible for the safety of the school speaks to the Nazi depravity being countered and bested by the kindness and strength of the conquered and overrun Belgians. This was a great talk and was rewarded with a rare but sincere standing acknowledgment by the Club.

"The Unibomber Case"

Joel Moss is a Supervisory Special Agent with the Federal Bureau of Investigation. He has been an Agent since 1976 and has been previously assigned to FBI Offices in Los Angeles, St. Louis and Miami. He has been assigned to the S. F. Office since 1984.

He is currently the Supervisory Agent for a squad of agents in S. F. with the responsibility for investigation of Government corruption and civil rights violation allegations. Joel has been a past speaker at our Rotary Club and spoke about "Slavery in the U. S."

His previous assignments has included being one of five investigators assigned to investigate the largest bank fraud case in FBI history (up to that time) in Miami from 1984-1986.

He coordinated the hunt for the 1996 Olympics bomber, Eric Rudolph, in North Carolina. When Eric was captured, Joel was in charge of opening up an office in North Carolina and organize the paperwork and evidence to be used for prosecution of Eric.

He was one of three Supervisors of the Unabomber Task Force from 1994-1998. Joel was the first investigator in the S. F. Office to receive the information that Ted Krazinsky was actually the Unabomber. He was a supervisor on the investigation and was there for the capture of the Unabomber. He will be talking on this latter investigation.
